

Starry Christmas Ornaments

Form a star with a piece of thin wire. String dried cranberries on the wire, and add a piece of thread to hang on the tree.

Apple Star Surprise

You need: apple, knife, paint, paint brush, & construction paper Cut the apple in half horizontally, so the stem is on top of one half. Brush a little paint on the cut side of the apple, being careful not to get any paint inside the core. Press the painted side of the apple on to the paper. Watch the star appear.

Super Star Relay Race

Cut two star shapes out of tissue paper. Divide everyone playing into two teams, line them up, and give each player a straw. The object is to pick up the star with the straw using suction power. Pass the star down the line using only the straws. The first team to the end wins.

Bible Stars "Guess Who"

Cut large star shapes out of construction paper. Write the name of a different Bible character on each star. Tape one star to each person's back. Each person goes around the room showing others their star and asking them 'yes' or 'no' questions until they quess the 'star' on their back.

Hidden Star

Using a white crayon, draw a large star or manger scene on a white piece of construction paper. Give the paper to a friend and have them cover the page in watercolors. Watch as your drawing mysteriously reveals itself.
