




As a parent, it's your responsibility to create an atmosphere of peace in the home. If you have one of those, "this is the worst day of my life", kind of days, you should not expect your children to figure this out and then bring peace to your troubled life. MEET THE LITTLE VOICES INSIDE YOUR HEAD.


