

***Hymn of Preparation #377** "It Is Well with My Soul"
Highlights History: In 1873, two years after losing a fortune in the great Chicago fire, Horatio G. Spafford decided to send his wife and four daughters to Europe where they were to attend evangelist meetings by D. L. Moody & Ira Sankey. On November 22, 1873, the ship Spafford's family was on collided with an iron sailing vessel. His four children did not survive. Spafford's wife was recovered, hanging on to a piece of the wreckage. Safe on land, she sent a message to her husband reading, "saved alone". Spafford immediately left the states to join his wife. While sailing over the site of the crash, he penned the words, "it is well". Later, he wrote this hymn based on that phrase.
