

Pastor's Letter

You're Not the Boss of Me: Redefining Emotions Through Faith - Fear

There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love. – 1 John 4:18 – ESV

When I was about 7 years old, my dad was doing some work on the roof of our two- story home. The aluminum extension ladder that he used was leaning against the house at a steep angle. I couldn't resist. I wanted to be on the roof with my dad. So, I started climbing up the ladder. I got to within a couple rungs from the roof when I froze. I couldn't move. I thought for sure I would die. The wind at that height was probably not much different than down below, but when mixed with my fear and anxiety, it felt like a storm determined to see me fall to my doom! I couldn't go up and I couldn't go down. I was convinced that the slightest move at all would be the last move of my life!

Fear can be paralyzing! Have you experienced it? How so? Was it on a ladder like me or in some other situation? Were you eventually set free, or are you still there unable to move up or down?

Fortunately for me, when I was stuck on that ladder, I was able to cry for help. My dad heard me and came over. Gently and patiently, he was able to coach me down the ladder one step at a time. "Just keep looking at me. I'm holding the ladder steady. It won't go anywhere. I've got you. I promise!"

I think of that experience when I read 1 John 4:18. God has promised to be with us. No matter the situation, we can cry out for help. God's love is so perfect that it drives out fear. And, as long as we keep our eyes on Jesus, our Lord will gently guide us through our fear. Our Lord will reach out and steady whatever metaphorical scary ladder we are stuck on, assuring us that he's got us. Sometimes, we are guided back down to the safety of the ground. But, other times, our Savior is encouraging us to keep climbing. "You're doing great! I'm with you. I'm going to help you every step of the way. You can do this!"

In the past two weeks, I have heard several people, both Democrats and Republicans, express concerns and fears about some of the decisions of our new president. Some fear for themselves and how these changes will affect their own lives. Others fear for their neighbors across the country whose situations put them at greater risk. Still others have expressed fear for the future of our country. Along with their fears are the emotions that often accompany fear such as feeling anxious, scared, insecure, worried and helpless.

At the same time, some of our siblings in Christ see our new president as making bold and courageous decisions that will make our country stronger and better. More than fear, they feel hopeful and encouraged.



Whatever our hopes and fears, whatever our political perspectives, as followers of Jesus and fellow members of Mentor UMC, what is God calling us to do? Based on 1 John 4:18, let us embrace love – love for God, love for one another, love for ourselves, even love for our fears. Can we listen to our fears and listen to the fears of one another? Can we listen to our hopes and the hopes of one another? How might we invite God to guide us into deeper understanding of one another, perfecting us in God's love, helping us channel our emotions of fear and hope toward compassion, humility, discernment and action? What can we learn from others who have responded to their fear with hope and action in faith?



Black History month reminds us of our African American siblings in Christ who demonstrated the power of love to make change. Let's learn and relearn the stories of those who heard God's voice calling them to keep moving, trusting that God was with them, trusting God's love to be witnessed through non-violent protests. Let's be reminded of the words of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., "Darkness cannot drive out darkness, only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate, only love can do that." Let Mentor UMC be known as a church where love that casts out fear is being perfected in Christ.



Nearly 60 years ago, a handful of teachers in Painesville, who were also members of the Painesville UMC, realized that some children weren't walking to school in the Winter because they didn't have coats to wear. Hope Chest was the ministry born out of that need.

Hope Chest has been providing coats, boots, gloves and other clothing to children in Lake Co ever since. Since then, they've expanded their service to include adult clothing & household goods. Several churches, including Mentor UMC, have partnered with Hope Chest from nearly the beginning.
