Army, he returned to<br>OSU and earned both Bachelor and Master of Arts degrees in music. He taught on the<br>music faculty for seven years. During this time he composed and arranged many hymns.<br>Beck left teaching and owned music publishing businesses. He died in 1987. The words to<br>the hymn we sing today were written by Fred Kaan, (1929–2009), a Dutch born minister<br>who preached in several churches in England. During World War II, his family was active in<br>the Dutch Resistance Movement. This hymn is inspired by John 15:12 which reads: My<br>command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.
