*OPENING HYMN "Trust and Obey (When We Walk with the Lord)" UMH 467 Hymn History: The words to this hymn were written by John H. Sammis. He was born in Brooklyn, New York in 1846 and was a successful businessman. He moved to Indiana and there became a Christian at age 22. He served in the Indiana YMCA before becoming a Presbyterian Minister. He served churches in the midwest before moving to Los Angeles and teaching at the Los Angeles Bible Institute. Sammis received the music from composer Daniel Towner (born 1850) who wrote it upon hearing a young man state that though he wasn't sure, he was going to trust and obey the Lord. This occurred at a meeting the young man attended in Brockton, Massachusetts conducted by Dwight L Moody in 1886. Sammis added the words to complete the hymn. Both Sammis and Towner died in 1919, Sammis in California and Towner in Missouri.
