Hymn History: The words and music to this hymn (and famous Christmas Carol) were written by John Hopkins Jr. He was born in Pittsburgh in 1820 where his father served as an Episcopal Bishop. He was one of twelve children. He moved with his family to Vermont where his father began the Episcopal Diocese of Vermont. Hopkins received Bachelors and Masters degrees from the University of Vermont. He became an Episcopal Priest himself in 1850. He never married. This hymn was written in 1857 as part of a Christmas pageant that his nieces and nephews took part in. Hopkins served churches in Plattsburgh, New York and Williamsport, Pennsylvania. He delivered the eulogy for the funeral of President U. S Grant in 1885. He died in Hudson, New York in 1891 and is buried next to his father in Vermont father in Vermont.
