HYMN OF CENTERING "Take Time to Be Holy" UMH 395 Hymn History: The words to this hymn were written by William Dunn Longstaff. He was born in Sunderland, England in 1822. His father was a wealthy ship owner and Longstaff was independently wealthy. Despite his riches his life had an emptiness to it. He became a Christian when he heard the preaching of Griffith john, a missionary to China who had returned to England. Griffith John recited I Peter 1:16, for it is written : "Be holy because I am holy." William used that passage as the basis for this hymn. Longstaff befriended Rev. Arthur Rees, a Welsh preacher who had left the Anglican Church because of a dispute and started the Bethesda Free Chapel in Sunderland with Longstaff as church treasurer. Longstaff also was friends with William Booth, the English Methodist preacher who founded the Salvation Army. Many of Longstaff hymns appeared in the Salvation Army's magazine, War Cry. William Longstaff died in Sunderland in 1894.


