Hymn History: This version of an Afro-American spiritual was arranged by Henry Thacker "Harry" Burleigh. Born in 1866 in Erie, Pa., Burleigh was a composer, arranger, vocalist. He was know for his rich baritone voice. He was the first African-American to be soloist at St. George's Episcopal Church in New York City. He met the famed composer Antonin Dvorak at the National Conservatory of Music of America in NYC where Burleigh was a student (and Dvorak the Director) and introduced him to the traditional music of African Americans. Dvorak incorporated themes from both African-Americans and Native Americans in his famous New World Symphony. Burleigh died in Stamford, Connecticut in 1949.


