But I say to you who are willing to hear: Love your enemies. – Luke 6:27

Pastor's Letter

Have you ever heard this verse? Did you know that Jesus tells us to love our enemies? My guess is that most of us have heard this before. I'd also guess that most of us don't think about this verse on a regular basis. If we are honest, we might even admit that this is one of those verses we tend to gloss over like other passages that make us uncomfortable. For such a short passage, it raises a lot of questions.

What does it mean to love someone? Is loving your enemy the same as loving your neighbor? Who is our enemy? Are we supposed to even have enemies? Should we not focus first on the people who mean the most to us before spending energy trying to love our enemies? After all, most of us could do a better job showing our love for our loved ones. What stories or exercises have shaped your understanding of love, enemies, of loving your enemies?

I remember when I was in the first grade. It was the first week of school. My assigned seat was next to a kid named Jimmy Thraw. In an effort to get to know Jimmy, I challenged him to a pencil fight! I pulled out my pencil and braced it between my hands inviting Jimmy to flick it with his pencil in an attempt to break it. Jimmy accepted the challenge and we carried out the fight discretely behind our desks so the teacher wouldn't see. After a few rounds, I succeeded in breaking Jimmy's pencil, thereby declaring myself the winner! But then, Jimmy pulled out another pencil and stabbed me in the arm with it! I was sent to the school nurse, and Jimmy was sent to the principal's office. I decided for certain on that day that Jimmy was not going to be a friend. Jimmy was my enemy! I still have a scar with a little piece of lead under my skin! Ask me, I'll show you.

A few weeks later, my parents were planning a birthday party for me. They asked me who I wanted to invite. I thought of about seven friends to invite. My dad said, "I think we should invite Jimmy Thraw." I said, "No way! He's not a friend, he's an enemy! Dad, he stabbed me with a pencil!" My dad persisted and Jimmy Thraw came to my party! Looking back, I'm glad he did.

Though at first, it was a bit awkward, but the end of the party, Jimmy apologized for stabbing me and thanked me for inviting him. We became friends and our friendship lasted throughout our school years.

I think of that experience with Jimmy when I read this passage about loving your enemies. What do you think about? How has this verse affected your life thus far? How might it affect your life ahead?

I look forward to wrestling with these questions together in worship this Sunday.
