Pastor's Letter "I must stay in your home today" - Jesus, Luke 19:5b

Have you ever said these words to anyone? Have you ever come up to someone you didn't know and say, "I must stay in your home today?" If so, I'd like to hear about it. I'm sure you have a story to tell.

In March, 1997, I was a second-year graduate student at Wesley Theological Seminary living in the men's dorm. The only money I had was from student loans. I was praying about what to do for the summer to make a little money when a friend told me about A Christian Ministry in the National Parks (ACMNP), You work with two or three others at one of the 63 national parks in the United States to provide worship services in the park. I was so excited! I love the outdoors and had always wanted to go out west. I applied and in April, I received my acceptance letter informing me that I would be working at Glacier National park in Montana! A dream come true! I began to make plans.

I would need to drive so I could bring my guitar, printer, library of commentaries and seminary books, tent, computer, music stand, trumpet - everything I might need to be able to plan and lead worship in Glacier Park! I would be driving the 2,300+ miles in my 1985 Acura Hatchback with over 150,000 miles across the country. It would have to do! When I told my sister about my adventure, I said, "I should take Carly and Chelsea with me for the road trip. It would be fun!" Carly and Chelsea are my sisters twin daughters. They were eight years old at the time. I was only half serious. But, my sister thought it was a great idea and suddenly, I was figuring out how to fit two kids and their bags into my hatchback.

I realized it was going to take three or four days to drive out there. I couldn't afford to staying hotels. So, I called United Methodist Churches all across the country asking if they would find someone to feed us dinner, give us a place to sleep and shower, feed us breakfast the next day, and we'd be on our way. I have to admit, it was a bit awkward calling strangers and asking if they'd let me and my two 8year-old nieces stay with them. But, God brought it all together and we had the best time ever! We stayed with a Korean pastor in Chicago, a United Methodist Women's president in Nebraska, and a retired District Superintendent widower in South Dakota. Carly and Chelsea still talk about that trip today.



Jesus needed a place to stay. He needed someone to welcome him into their home and to provide him with food. As far as we can tell in the Bible, Jesus didn't have a paying job. He relied on the good will and hospitality of others. When he told Zacchaeus "I must stay in your home today," Zacchaeus welcomed him happily.

Lord, let us be like Zacchaeus, ready and happy to welcome Jesus in. And, let us be like Jesus, willing to invite ourselves into someone else's life that we might each experience your presence with us. Amen.
