Pastor's Letter

Hello, Siblings in Christ,

I am blessed to be writing to you this week as we are on our fifth Sunday in our series, "This Is Us: Being United Methodist Christians." This week, I have the honor and pleasure to share with you one of my favorite things about being United Methodist: God's abundant grace! Prior to becoming Methodist, I did not fully understand grace in the way that John Wesley describes it. As I grew in my faith, and more importantly in my understanding of what it means to be a United Methodist, I heard these words that described grace.

I remember going on the Walk to Emmaus and hearing these different types of grace: prevenient, justifying, and sanctifying. Even after that amazing weekend retreat, I still struggled to keep them straight in my head. It was during my United Methodist Doctrine class in the summer of 2022 that I was able to really grasp what Wesley meant by these types of grace. The following passage has helped me to understand what God's grace means throughout my life as a follower of Jesus Christ.

"In one metaphor Wesley compares religion to a house. Repentance is the porch, justification is the door, and sanctification is the whole house. While the goal is being in the house, one must cross the porch and go through the doorway to get there. Similarly, in most cases, crossing the porch is of moderate duration, passing through the doorway is of short duration, and exploring the house could and should take a lifetime."

This is taken from Scott J. Jones's book United Methodist Doctrine: The Extreme Center on page 175.

When we read Luke 15:11-24, we are able to see God's grace at work in the life of the prodigal son. He has a great life but wants to explore the world. As he wanders around, he is experiencing God's prevenient grace without even knowing that is what is happening. When he realizes the error of his ways, he is repentant and realizes that he can go home to his father. Here we see God's justifying grace taking place in his life. When he goes home, he is welcomed with open and loving arms by his father. His dad even hosts an extravagant party for him. This is God's sanctifying grace welcoming him home. It is a beautiful example for us as we seek to not only understand God's amazing and abundant grace but to see how God's grace is at work in our own lives.

You may be experiencing God's prevenient grace where you are not fully aware of God in your life. You may be at the point where you recognize that you need to make some changes, and you ask God to be present fully in your life accepting God's justifying grace. You may be living a life with God at the center, living out the call that God has placed on your life. You are experiencing God's sanctifying grace and sharing the Good News of Jesus with others.

Wherever you may be on your faith journey, please know you are welcome to journey with the Mentor United Methodist family. As a family, we share our lives with one another as we seek to grow closer to God through Jesus Christ.


