Led By God's Spirit

Lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. - Ephesians 4:1-3 NRSV

We are now into our 6th week of our worship series and study, "This is Us: Being United Methodists". This week we focus on the question, "How do United Methodists nurture our spiritual lives?"

In Paul's letter to the church in Ephesus, in the scripture quoted above, he encourages believers to "lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called..." and to "make every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." Do this, Paul says, "with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love."

Paul's words of encouragement offer Christians in all times powerful advice. Imagine a world where every human being is living this out! That may be asking too much. Imagine a nation where all of its leaders and citizens are living into their calling with humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love! Ok, that might be a stretch for our imaginations too. How about a city? Can you imagine, just for a moment, a city where every resident—high paid, low paid, white collar, blue collar, retired or unemployed, laborer, manager, and CEO—every one of them making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace? What would that look like?

Whether we are able to imagine it or not, clearly this is the world God intends. As Christians, as United Methodist Christians, we each have a calling to do our best to live by God's Spirit in these ways. Can we do it? Is it possible? John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, believed it is possible in this life, by God's grace, to be made perfect in love. But, we cannot do it on our own.

Wesley insisted that the people called Methodists be part of a small group. He called them Classes. Each class consisted of about 12 people from the same community. The purpose was simply to meet weekly for one or two hours and share with one another how each had done that week with the three rules: 1. Do no harm 2. Do good 3. Stay in love with God. Scholars of Methodism agree that the key to the exponential growth of the Methodist movement in the 1700s and 1800s was the structure of these accountability groups.

The third rule, "Stay in love with God" is all about practicing spiritual disciplines such as regular worship and daily devotion, Bible study, prayer, caring for the poor, the sick and imprisoned and holy conferencing. As we begin the last week in our series, "This is Us: Being United Methodists", I pray we will be encouraged and inspired to renew our covenant and walk with Christ. If you are not already participating in a small group or ministry, now is a good time to do so. If you need some help knowing what group or ministry best fits you, contact Pastor Ivy, Pastor Tammy or me. We'd love to help you take the next step on your journey of faith.
